NEW SMYRNA ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TO BE BUILT ON BELMONT HILLS SITE

A new elementary school promised for Smyrna will be located on the Belmont Hills development near Campbell High School

The school district has identified property between Ward Street and Atlanta Road, immediately north and east of Campbell High School.

The new school was approved by voters in 2008 as part of the school capital projects program funded by a Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax. The new school would open in the fall of 2013. The 18-acre site is contiguous to both the Belmont Hills redevelopment area and the back entrance of Campbell High School, and is less than one mile from the Smyrna Village Green.

As part of the school construction project, the school district has offered to purchase the Smyrna Commons apartment complex that was recently acquired by the City of Smyrna's Downtown Area Development Corporation. The apartment complex would become vacant once all leases run their full course and expire by early 2012. The SDADC had purchased the complex as part of right-of-way acquisition for construction of a future Atlanta

Road-Ward Street connector that is part of the Cobb County's 2011 SPLOST referendum. The 7.5-acre parcel to be obtained by the school district would border the new road and will be converted to playing fields and open space that could be used by the new elementary school as well as Campbell High School, and also could be made available for community use after school hours (see Parcel 3 on the attached map).

"This is an excellent proposal that would seem to serve the entire community well," said Tim Stultz, a member of the Cobb County Board of Education who represents the Smyrna area. "I am looking forward to opening a new, state-of-the-art school that will fit perfectly with the eventual redevelopment of the area. We hope, in fact, that a school of this quality will help spur redevelopment sooner than it may otherwise occur. I am also proud of the fact that we are partnering with the City of Smyrna to help improve the area. This new school and the entire development will benefit this community for decades to come."

The school board was to vote on the proposed \$7.8 million land acquisition at its regular meeting on Feb. 17.

cost of \$110 million, and we are widening and improving several congestion spots through out the County. Completed: the Stilesboro Road improvements for \$15.1 million.

construction is the Windy Hill/Macland Con-Road nector (\$27 million), completion date is August 31, the Barrett Parkwidenway ing from four to six lanes, \$27 million estimated, expected com-

pletion - December 2012; Big Shanty Road improvements which will provide an east-west reliever for Chastain Rd and Barrett Parkway. Being done in three phases the County has partnered with Georgia Department of Transportation and Town Center CID, to complete this \$18 million project. Phase 3 will be finished this month, and Phases 1 and 2 will be completed in April of 2012.

The point is, all of these projects, and many more, were paid for by the monies raised in our 2005 SPLOST which expires in December 2011. The Cobb SPLOST is and has been critical in keeping our property taxes low -- Cobb is the lowest taxed

THE CROSSINGS AT FOUR CORNERS REDEVELOPMENT BREAKS GROUND

New life is coming to the Four Corners area of South Cobb Drive and Concord Road in Smyrna. A different style of groundbreaking was held Feb. 8 complete with the traditional shovels and hard-hats livened up by the addition of a backhoe knocking down a former bank drive-through.

"A lot of folks told us this day would never happen; but it's finally happening," said Smyrna Mayor Max Bacon, about the new 93,000 square foot Kroger with a gas station will anchor a remodeled shopping center called The Crossings at Four Corners. "We've been working on this for the past three to four years. There won't be anything like it around here."

Eight acres of the project will be home to a 96,000 square foot Kroger, the company's largest grocery store in the area. In addition to the new Kroger, the redevelopment of The Crossings at Four Corners will include the installation of a traffic light at the north property line of the project and South Cobb Drive, the renovation of 60,000-square-feet of retail space and the development of eight outparcels available for lease or sale; as well as a 25,000 square foot pad available for a new anchor tenant, located adjacent to Kroger.

The project is being built by Westchester, Ill.-based Tri-Land Properties, Inc. "Our primary business for the last 25 years is acquiring old run-down centers and redeveloping them," said Hugh Robinson, executive vice president of Tri-Land.

"We're thrilled to bring The Crossings at Four Corners to the residents of Smyrna and the surrounding region," said Robinson. "The project will breathe new life into the South Cobb Drive corridor, bringing great new retailers to the market.

FEBRUARY IS NEWSPAPER OWNERSHIP MONTH

February is the Lipsett month for new beginnings. Specifically, it is our month for starting new ventures in newspaper publishing.

The Bright Side Newspapers for Smyrna/Vinings and for Mableton/Austell are not the first newspapers Allan and I have owned. We bought our first weekly newspaper several decades ago in Camden County, Georgia. Our second venture in weekly newspaper ownership was in another metro county, included outside partners, and was not as hands on or as long-lasting.

Our third newspaper ownership and publishing venture is the *The Bright Side* Smyrna/Vinings. We started publishing it in February 2005 and the Mableton/Austell edition was started in 2006. This has been a very rewarding endeavor both personally and professionally.

Owning and publishing a weekly newspaper before the age of personal computers, internet, digital cameras, and cell phones was much more labor intensive. Previously, we had a large staff with reporters and both front and back shop employees. Owning and publishing *The Bright Side*, in this age of instant communication, means we can keep our employees to just the two of us (with assist from contract sales help). Publishing good news simplifies things as well. We no longer cover every meeting of city councils, commissioners, school boards and other commissions and committees. We rely on some coverage by us personally with most of our news supplied by folks in our community

by folks in our community.

We also don't sell subscriptions. We go by direct mail into 20,000 homes with each edition. We distribute by postal carrier and rural route. We are gratified that so many people want to receive the paper; more than we can afford to send the paper to. However, for those not on our mailing lists, we have copies available at various locations throughout the community. The routes do change as the post office changes the routes. I try to stay on top of the changes, but sometimes one route is dropped and another picked up. I continually make adjustments to our mailing list.

The number of pages changes from month to month depending on the amount of advertising sold. Our advertisers are the

representatives from the City of Smyrna including Mayor Bacon and Councilman Mike McNabb, who took leadership roles for the city on the project; Hugh Robinson of Tri-Land Properties, the property owner and re-development specialist; Paul Xhajanka, Real Estate Manager for The Kroger Company; and State Sen. The new Kroger store will offer a fuel station, bakery and deli products, a floral department, a wine shop and drivethru pharmacy. The former retail center, The Crossings, was built about 1971 and was the home of a Winn-Dixie. Tri-Land bought the property in 1996 and had tenants until last year.

Well, we do work at producing it, but it is a creation that we started; that we are responsible for. We publish *The Bright Side* as part of the public relations and advertising firm we started in 1992. We are newspaper journalists; we're not trying to be a glossy magazine and we're not just an online newsletter. We are a monthly newspaper with news and advertising and a very impressive circulation. We charge for advertising but not for news. We would love to give everyone free ads but then we would no longer be in business.

There are other Bright Side publications in Cobb County owned by our friend Carol Thompson. Carol started the original Bright Side nearly two decades ago. She owns her publications and we own ours but we can create an advertising buy for a customer in combination with the two companies that will reach more than 100,000 homes in Cobb County.

As we begin our seventh year of publishing the Smyrna Vinings *Bright Side*, we want to say thank you to the advertisers, community "reporters", and readers who have given the paper life during the past years. We look forward to a bright future as we continue to be a newspaper of choice in Southern Cobb.



THE SPANISH ISLAND

519 years ago, the Spanish sent three ships west into oceans unknown to find a quicker trade route to the Far East. The ships were manned by 77 men of all sorts: adventurers, mercenaries, even criminals

awaiting sentence. The success of the trip was remote with no guarantee anyone would ever return from the journey alive but, after 31 days at sea, the Genovese captain finally sighted land. It was an island so lush, green and rich that Christopher Columbus was moved to call it, "the Pearl of the Caribbean". He also called it the "Spanish island",

and so it became known as "Hispaniola".

Of course, Hispaniola today is comprised of two countries, Haiti, to the west and, to the east, the Dominican Republic, the site of the most recent chiropractic mission trip by Chiromissions, led by Dr. Peter Morgan. I joined this trip myself because I missed that feeling of excitement and revelation I experienced in Tibet last year and, to be sure, working with the Dominican people, I got it in spades.

5,000 years before Columbus' journey, Hispaniola was populated by the Arawak and other tribes from from Central and South America. They eventually blended to become the peaceful Taino people, which Columbus first encountered and called, "Indians", because he believed he'd actually landed in India. On Columbus' second trip back in 1493, he found the Taino population diminished, partly due to disease and partly to attack by a cannibalistic, warriortribe known as the Carib. To support the booming agriculture the Europeans brought with colonization, African slaves were imported to assist the Taino in the fields.

Ultimately, all these populations: White, Black, Taino/Carib, all mixed and became today's Dominican people.

"Haiti", the Taino word for "mountainous land", was colonized in the 1600's by the French and quickly became known as

the "Jewel of the Caribbean", the richest island there or anywhere else in the world, it was thought. But the French also achieved this on the back of African slavery and finally, in the early 1800's, with the passionate scent of the American and French revolutions still in the air, a slave revolt resulted in the slaughter of virtually every French

man, woman and child in the territory and marked the beginning of Haiti's decline, which seems not yet to have reached its

It is these, and many other populations that chiropractic missionaries go to serve, at their own expense, to heal the sick and to bring the power of chiropractic to the consciousness of the world. On this mission, 49 doctors and students worked in churches in the northern Dominican Republic for a week and adjusted over 7,000 people, from babies to those with crutches and wheelchairs. One 8-year-old child I adjusted, named David, was in a wheelchair with cerebral palsey. When we were finished he tried to speak the first words of his life to thank me and say, "Goodbye". These missions are full of small miracles and I was proud to be among those who served. I will do it again. Looking forward to Cuba!







SPLOST VOTE IS NOT A TAX INCREASE

county in the region. The Cobb SPLOST allows our County to function with cash. The loss of this revenue would force the county to raise property taxes, incur costly deferment of maintenance, and rely on debt (borrow ing) or all of the above to keep pace with our growth. Bottom line SPLOST funds provide a vehicle for our community to pay as we go instead of putting debt off on our kids and grand kids.

The needs of the 2011 SPLOST have been gathered from 25 public meetings meetings held to review, discuss and revise the list of SPLOST projects. The four year SPLOST which begins January 1, 2012 and runs through December 31, 2015 is projected to generate \$492,068,482 in revenue for Cobb County and our six cities. The monies stay right here in our collective pockets- none are shared with either the State or the Federal government. Fiftyone percent (\$250,885,000) will be used for transportation improvements. The six cities will share \$129,515,662 (26 percent)

to use on projects they have already determined, \$82,023,000 (17 percent) will be set aside for Parks, Recreation & Cultural Affairs, \$16,748,420 (3 percent) will be used to revitalize public facilities (including libraries, senior services, judicial and public health buildings) and 3 percent (\$12,898,400) is designated for Public Safety

Ås citizens, we have the opportunity to continue investing in our future on March 15, 2011 by voting YES. A YES vote for the 2011 Cobb SPLOST is not a tax increase -- it is, in fact, a continuation of our current sales tax rate of 6 cents on the dollar, of which a penny is designated for SPLOST. Our sales tax is the lowest in the region. More information is available at www.cobbsplost2011.org, including a very detailed booklet on exactly where the money will be spent, how and why.
